- Network with other audit professionals.
- Earn CPE for participation in meetings or on projects.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR IIA SERVICE

To serve, you should:

- Be an IIA member in good standing.
- Have specific expertise or relevant experience.
- Be fluent in English.
- Be able to commit time and pay for your travel and meeting expenses (or have your employer/Institute/chapter cover expenses).
- Agree to comply with The IIA's conflict of interest and code of business conduct and ethics.
- Meet CIA certification requirements as noted for board and/or committee.
- Provide a CV/Resume and/or Cover Letter – any attached document titles must include your first initial and last name.
- Provide a self-nomination along with two (2) professional references.

GENERAL TIME COMMITMENT

- Terms are one, two, or three years. However, members may be dropped at the end of any year due to lack of participation or the changing needs of the committee or Board.
- Attendance is expected at annual meetings:
 - Chapter Relations meets in April in conjunction with Leadership Academy and in early December at IIA Headquarters in Lake Mary, Florida.
 - Global committees meet in June/July in conjunction with the International Conference (locations vary).
 - Some committees hold additional or alternate meetings during the year or communicate via conference calls between meetings.
 - The Global Board meets three times per year with three to four virtual calls.
 - The North American Board meet two times per year with a virtual call, if needed.
- Attendance is encouraged at seminars/conferences in support of IIA activities.
- Work time, other than the above meeting times, averages 10–50 hours per year. However, some Board and committee members' time may exceed 100 hours per year.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

All volunteer leaders must sign an annual code of business conduct and ethics certification statement to ensure that members act in the best interest of The IIA.

NOTE: Volunteers may not contemporaneously serve on the Global Board or the NA Board and any chapter or institute board; this policy does not apply to the Board of Trustees.

DESCRIPTION OF POSITION REQUIREMENTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

OFFICERS (SUPERVISORY COMMITTEE)

Service on The IIA's Supervisory Committee (Officers of the Global Board) is considered one of the pinnacles of volunteering within The IIA governance and committee structure. To assist potential candidates in evaluating whether they are ready for serious consideration by the Global Nominating Committee, the following guidance is provided.

- Must be a CIA with a proven track record as a leader within The IIA, typically as a senior leader at the regional or global level.
- Must have support from other volunteer leaders familiar with the requirements and recognized in the profession.
- Must possess a global perspective, strategic focus, excellent leadership and communication skills, with extensive practice experience as either a Chief Audit Executive, partner or director in a professional services firm, or a thought leader in governance, risk management and/or internal control.
- Must have the ability to attend at least three in-person meetings each year, participate in four to six teleconferences and have time to fulfill the responsibilities assigned to them.
- Must be collaborative in working with a team of 10-12 people.
- Must be fluent in English, which is the official language of the Global Board/Supervisory Committee.

CHAIR OF THE BOARD (1)

Responsibilities: Serve as chief elected officer of The Institute; preside at all meetings of The IIA Global Board of Directors, and the Supervisory Committee; and serve, along with the President and CEO, as spokesperson for The IIA.

Note: Senior Vice Chair of the Board is expected to succeed as Chair of the Board, therefore, this position is not open to nomination.

SENIOR VICE CHAIR OF THE BOARD (1)

Responsibilities: Initiate, approve, and monitor strategic planning activities for consideration of the Global Board. The Senior Vice Chair is expected to succeed as Chair at the end of the Chair's term or upon vacancy of that office.

Note: Must have served on The IIA Global Board of Directors to apply for this position.

VICE CHAIR— FINANCE (1)

Responsibilities: Working with The IIA CFO, help to ensure the establishment and maintenance of adequate controls for safeguarding the funds of The IIA; maintain, review, and approve financial, budgetary, and contractual policies and procedures; review all financial reports of The IIA; and chair the Finance Committee.

OUTSIDE NORTH AMERICA DIRECTOR (1)

Responsibilities: Serves as a member of the Supervisory Committee; advises on Global Assembly initiatives/topics; serves as a sounding board for Directors outside North America. This position is selected by the Global Nominating Committee and is not a position open to nomination.

IMMEDIATE PAST CHAIR OF THE BOARD (1)

Responsibilities: Provides advice and counsel to the Chair, Senior Vice Chair, and other Directors of the Global Board. Serves as an Officer of the Global Board and member of the Global Nominating Committee.

NORTH AMERICAN BOARD CHAIR (1)

Responsibilities: Oversees the North American Board discussions and actions, assists in establishing relationships with NA professional organizations and serves as a Global Board Director and member of the Supervisory Committee. Also serves as a member of the NA Nominating committee.

Note: The Senior Vice Chair of the NA Board is expected to succeed as Chair of the NA Board, therefore this position is not open to nomination.

BOARD MEMBERS

TOP 10 NATIONAL INSTITUTE DIRECTORS (Minimum: 5)

Nominees come from the Top 10 National Institutes as noted on page 1 and should have the support of their National Institute. Nominees must be CIAs. Directors should not serve more than two consecutive terms in the same position.

Note: See page 8 for the process of selecting the Top 10 National Institutes.

NORTH AMERICAN DIRECTORS (4)

Qualifications: Directors are selected for special expertise, global perspective, and a broad mix of regions or industries to help balance the Board. Candidates must be CIAs.

Responsibilities: In addition to Board responsibilities, NA Directors will serve as members of the North American Board. They may also serve on IIA task forces as assigned by the Chair of the Board or the Supervisory Committee. The North American Board usually meets in-person two times a year, one in conjunction with the annual IIA Leadership Academy in April and typically in the Fall.

Note: The NA Board Chair and Sr. Vice Chair are automatic positions to the Global Board.

DIRECTORS-AT-LARGE (4)

Nominations may come from institutes, chapters, or the membership at large. Nominees should be CIAs.

Qualifications: At-large positions are reserved for members with special expertise or from institutes, chapters or areas that will help balance the Board geographically or strategically. One at-large position is the chair of the Audit Committee (must be CIA).

Responsibilities: Directors-at-large may oversee or participate with committees, assist in promoting The IIA within their assigned areas, and perform special tasks assigned by the Chair of the Board.

INTERNAL AUDIT FOUNDATION

OFFICERS

The President other Officers and Trustees are elected by the members of the Internal Audit Foundation.

Officers are:

- Senior Vice President – Strategy
- Vice President – Finance & Development
- Vice President – Content (Chair of Committee of Research & Education Advisors)

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Includes officers listed above.

Qualifications: Trustees are usually chief audit executives or directors of internal auditing from diverse industries, senior governmental auditors, and professors in internal auditing. The Chair of the Committee of Research and Education Advisors serves as the Vice President - Content.

Responsibilities: As the governing body for the Internal Audit Foundation, trustees establish the research and academic strategies for the Foundation. They also develop fundraising strategies and leverage their connections and experience to enhance the Foundation's impact. Trustees meet in person in June/July and three times virtually throughout the year. Trustees are asked to make a personally meaningful financial donation to the Foundation.

DISTRICT ADVISORS AND DISTRICT REPRESENTATIVES (NORTH AMERICA ONLY)

(North America includes United States, Canada, Guyana, Bermuda, and Caribbean Chapters as assigned.)

Qualifications: Normally will have held the office of chapter president or served on an IIA committee. Candidates must be CIAs. District Advisors should have served as District Representatives. Special consideration is given to candidates recommended by chapters within the district, or by representatives from within the district.

Responsibilities: Provide leadership, guidance, and assistance to chapters assigned, conduct district leadership workshops, assist in planning and participate in the annual Leadership Conference, and serve on the Chapter Relations Committee (CRC). The CRC meets in April and December.

Note: District Advisors and District Representatives serve two-year terms up to 4 years maximum and are elected at the annual North American Business Meeting in April and take office immediately.



THE INSTITUTE OF INTERNAL AUDITORS COMMITTEE SUMMARY

DESCRIPTION OF COMMITTEE REQUIREMENTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

COMMITTEE SUMMARIES

The primary function of IIA committees is to develop programs and strategies to achieve the goals and objectives of The IIA and to provide advice and counsel to the headquarters staff. Most terms are usually for three years, unless otherwise noted, with one-third of the members' terms expiring each year. Members may be dropped annually if not effectively contributing to committee work and should not serve more than two consecutive terms on the same committee. Members are expected to pay for travel and expenses (or have employer/Institute/chapter covers expenses) to one or two in-person meetings per year. The following are brief summaries of committee missions and compositions and any special requirements for participation.

CANADIAN ADVISORY COMMITTEE*

Mission: Dedicated to promoting and developing the internal audit profession in Canada, focusing on services and perspectives unique to the Canadian context. The CAC advises the North American Board (NAB) on matters including advocacy, research, training, and networking within the internal audit community.

Composition: Six to nine members, representing a cross-section of Canadian membership and reflect a diverse range of backgrounds, skills, and perspectives within the internal audit profession. No less than two-thirds shall be internal audit professionals. Committee terms are two years.

CHAPTER RELATIONS COMMITTEE*

Mission: To assist North American chapter leadership as a resource and liaison to The Institute in enabling chapters to meet their objectives: that the professional practice of internal auditing is effectively promoted through a full range of quality services to members; and that effective strategies are developed to address issues and opportunities at the chapter level.

Composition: Restricted to elected District Representatives and District Advisors. Must be CIAs. Committee terms are two years.

*Committee reports to the North American Board. Terms begin April 2026.

COMMITTEE OF RESEARCH AND EDUCATION ADVISORS

Mission: To support the Internal Audit Foundation by driving research and academic initiatives that strengthen the internal audit profession. Through the development of innovative research and the advancement of academic programs, CREA builds critical skills, expands knowledge, and helps grow the talent pipeline. By empowering current and future internal auditors to stay relevant in a rapidly evolving landscape, CREA contributes to the Foundation's mission to help organizations create, protect, and sustain long-term value.

Composition: Members who reflect the diverse global perspectives of the internal audit profession. Members are selected based on their expertise, including emerging trends and contributions to internal audit research and education. Committee terms are three years, with the opportunity to serve up to two terms.

ENTERPRISE RISK MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Mission: To support internal auditors and enterprise risk management (ERM) professionals by developing and promoting best practices in corporate governance and the internal assurance ecosystem, equipping stakeholders with the ERM knowledge and resources they need to strengthen risk management capabilities and enhance organizational resilience.

Composition: Committee members have broad experience at a senior level in their organizations and are attuned to the changing nature of the global enterprise risk management and internal audit professions.



THE INSTITUTE OF INTERNAL AUDITORS COMMITTEE SUMMARY

EXAM DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

Mission: To ensure that the content of The IIA's certification exams and assessments are continuously aligned with and reflect the current global practice of internal auditing, including the International Professional Practices Framework.

Composition: Must hold a CIA. Members are selected to reflect the diverse global perspective of the profession, including specialty certification knowledge and expertise.

Note: This committee is a sub-committee of the Professional Certification Board.

INSTITUTE RELATIONS COMMITTEE

Mission: To support global communication, collaboration, and cooperation among The IIA and its Institutes, consistent with the principles of One IIA. And to support growth into new geographies and to contribute to a strong global presence for The IIA.

Composition: The committee shall consist of between fifteen (15) and twenty-five (25) members from around the world. Committee members must be active within The IIA in their countries or regions, including with local or regional institutes and chapters and with associated organizations in order to fulfil their responsibilities. Members must be able to bring both a local and a global perspective to their work, have governance and leadership experience, and be able to act collaboratively in the best interest of The IIA. Holders of professional certifications from The IIA are preferable.

INTERNATIONAL INTERNAL AUDIT STANDARDS BOARD

Mission: To serve the global internal audit profession, its stakeholders, and the public interest by developing, issuing, maintaining, and promoting the Global Internal Audit Standards.

Composition: The IASB is comprised of a minimum of fourteen (14) internal audit practitioners and up to two additional nonvoting, advisory stakeholder representatives who are not members of The IIA but have standard-setting or relevant experience. Members represent a broad range of experience at senior levels of an internal audit function. CIA is required for all IIA members.

GLOBAL GUIDANCE COUNCIL

Mission: To serve the global internal audit profession, its stakeholders, and the public interest by developing, issuing, maintaining, and promoting Topical Requirements, Global Guidance, and Thought Leadership.

Composition: A minimum of twenty-six (26) internal audit practitioners and two additional nonvoting advisory stakeholder representatives who are not members of The IIA but have standard-setting or similar relevant experience. All members, except the two nonvoting members, must hold a CIA.

PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATIONS BOARD

Mission: To govern, advocate and promote IIA's global certification and qualification programs that are recognized as the global benchmark for the profession; Contribute to the competency, recognition, and professionalism of internal auditors; Evolve to meet current and expected global needs of internal audit professionals; Uphold the equitable and fair treatment of all candidates globally; and Ensure consistent application globally

Composition: The Professional Certifications Board (PCB) is comprised of Certified Internal Auditors who reflect the diverse global perspective of the profession. The PCB will consist of no less than nine (9) members. CIA is required for all IIA members

Note: The size of committees varies depending on the scope of the activities of the committee.



THE INSTITUTE OF INTERNAL AUDITORS

THE IIA NOMINATING PROCESS

The IIA has two nominating committees. The North American Nominating Committee meets in November and December 2025 to recommend the slate of nominees for the North American Board and the North American committees. The Global Nominating Committee meets in January 2026 to select the slate of nominees for the Global Board of Directors and Internal Audit Foundation Board of Trustees. Committee chairs are appointed in early February 2026 by the Chair of the Board Nominee and assist in selecting the members to serve on committees. Committee appointments are completed in February, with committee terms beginning in April or June 2026.

OFFICERS AND BOARD PROCESS

The IIA's Global Nominating Committee meets in November 2025 to select the list of nominees to be interviewed. Interviews are scheduled and completed in December 2025 and early January 2026. The Global Nominating Committee meets mid-January 2026 to select a slate of Global Board nominees, and to confirm Board candidates for North America and the Board of Trustees. Note that approximately half of the Board positions are selected each year.

NATIONAL INSTITUTE DIRECTORS

The Top 10 National Institutes which have seats on the board are determined by the average number of members and the average institute revenues over a two-year period. The calculations are revisited every two years. The National Institute candidates should have the recommendation of their Institute to be considered by the Global Nominating Committee.

NORTH AMERICAN DIRECTORS

Members in North America (NA) are asked to submit candidates for the open positions on the NA Board. NA Directors oversee NA activities. Four (4) NA Board Directors also serve on the Global Board of Directors. The IIA's NA Nominating Committee recommends a final list of NA candidates for the Board of Directors to the Global Nominating Committee.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF SLATES

The slate of Global officers and board nominees is announced to the members via the website or electronic communications at least 120 days before the Annual Business Meeting (ABM). Nominees are elected during the ABM, which will be held on 24 June 2026 in conjunction with The IIA's International Conference in Singapore.

The slate of NA Board officers and NA Board nominees is announced to the members via the website or electronic communications at least 60 days before the Annual NA Membership Meeting. Nominees are elected during the Membership Meeting, which will be held on 19 April 2026 in conjunction with The IIA's Leadership Academy in Orlando, Florida.

INTERNAL AUDIT FOUNDATION PROCESS

The IIA's Global Nominating Committee confirms the recommended slate of candidates presented by the Foundation's Succession Planning Committee for the Board of Trustees. The slate of officers will be presented to the Internal Audit Foundation members for election in Q2 2026.

IIA COMMITTEE PROCESS

The Global Board Chair works with the Global Nominating Committee and Committee Chairs to select nominees for each committee. Efforts are made to ensure that each committee has a broad cross-section of members. Certification, geographical representation, industry, experience, skills, and any specific requirements of the committee are taken into consideration.

New global committee members are appointed in February to fill terms beginning in June 2026. The committee in-person meeting is usually held once a year, with the first meeting immediately following the International Conference in June with virtual calls scheduled throughout the year. Terms are for one to three years, although committee chairs may drop members who have not effectively contributed to committee work. Appointments may also be made to fill vacancies.

For committees designated as North American (NA), the NA Nominating Committee works with the committee chairs to select the committee members. NA committees typically meet in conjunction with the Annual Leadership Conference in April with additional meetings as scheduled (in-person and/or virtual).

NORTH AMERICAN BOARD PROCESS

The NA Nominating Committee meets in November and December to select a slate of candidates to serve as officers and members of the NA Board. The slate is provided to the Global Nominating Committee for final approval in January. All nominees will be notified in mid-January and elected by the NA membership during the Annual Leadership Conference in April with the four (4) candidates that are elected to the Global Board of Directors elected by the global membership in June 2026.

CHAPTER RELATIONS COMMITTEE AND CANADIAN ADVISORY COMMITTEE PROCESS

(NORTH AMERICA ONLY)

The NA Nominating Committee selects the slate of candidates for the open Canadian Advisory Committee and the District Advisor and District Representative positions in North America. District Advisors and District Representatives serve on the Chapter Relations Committee (CRC).

The slate of members for the Canadian Advisory Committee and the District Advisor and District Representative nominees are announced to members via The IIA website and candidates are elected during an annual NA Membership Meeting held in April in conjunction with The IIA's annual Leadership Conference.
