Get Involved: IIA Seattle Leadership Opportunities

Looking to deepen your involvement with the IIA Seattle Chapter and help shape the future of our community? We are currently seeking engaged members to step into Officer and Board leadership roles for the upcoming Chapter year 2026-27 (June 1, 2026 through May 31, 2027).

Officer Positions

Officer roles require a minimum one-year commitment, with a two-year term strongly encouraged to support continuity and effectiveness. Below are a list of our current Officer positions. Officers can earn 20 CPE credits each year for their volunteer commitment.

Vice President of Conferences

Leads planning and execution of the Chapter's annual Fraud Conference and other conference offerings, including sponsorships, speakers, logistics, and CPE delivery.

Vice President of Communications

Oversees Chapter communications, including the monthly newsletter, annual report, LinkedIn presence, and monitoring the Chapter email inbox.

Vice President of Programming

Manages non-conference educational programming such as webinars, roundtables, and in-person events, ensuring high-quality CPE offerings aligned with IIA standards.

Vice President of Membership

Drives member recruitment, onboarding, engagement, recognition, and analysis of membership trends to support Chapter growth.

Vice President of Certifications

Promotes IIA certifications and continuing professional development, monitors certification trends, and supports certification growth and reengagement efforts.

Treasurer

Oversees Chapter financial operations, budgeting, reporting, internal controls, and compliance with IIA financial requirements.

Assistant Treasurer

Supports the Treasurer by sharing treasury responsibilities, assisting with financial reporting, and maintaining appropriate segregation of duties.

Secretary

Maintains official Chapter records, meeting minutes, documentation, required filings, and coordinates Officer and Board meeting schedules.

Board of Governors – Now Accepting Interest

The Board of Governors provides strategic oversight by directing and approving key strategies and activities of the Chapter. Governors support the President and Voting Officers by offering guidance, resources, and institutional knowledge to enable the Chapter's long-term success.

Governors must commit to a minimum two-year term.

Description: Every organization is racing toward "AI governance," but many still lack the basic governance foundations to make it real. We'll focus on practical building blocks — policy and exception governance, mandatory training, leadership oversight, and integrated metrics — that create a scalable foundation for governing both current and emerging risks, including AI. Leaders in Trust, Risk, and Compliance will leave with a concise blueprint for getting governance right before layering on AI and the next wave of technologies.

Speaker: Krishna Sheshabhatar is the Head of Governance at Atlassian, where he leads the enterprise governance strategy and implementation within the Governance, Risk & Compliance organization. His work focuses on building practical, scalable hub-and-spoke governance models that align policies, standards, controls, and risk management across multiple domains. Before joining Atlassian, Krishna served as a Director of GRC at Expedia Group, leading their Governance & Risk Management functions and driving the maturation of risk and control practices in a complex, global environment.
